Fall 2022 Report

I want to thank you all for allowing me to be your Treasurer for Region 5. This continues to be a service position that both challenges me and keeps me abstinent every day. I apologize for the long report but it is budget time!

The Budget!!!

The current budget information, including the current income and expenditures plus the draft 2023 budget, are in this packet. The comments below are just a summary.

The expenses for this year continue to be under-budget, mostly due to our extensive use of virtual technology. However, we also allowed monies for committee programs and Intergroup assistance that have not been used. We do have several active committees this year, including the Outreach subcommittees and the Media committee that have been in discussion around projects for the coming year. Since I didn't get any requests from committees for budgets, I adjusted the 2023 budget to try to better reflect the information I have seen, for a total of \$6700 allocated across the 7 committees. If your committee has a different need, please try to send me that information before we finalize the 2023 budget at our final Assembly session on October 30th.

We also spent less than expected on World Service Business Conference due to the meeting moving from in person to virtual. I expect the WSBC to be in person in 2023 and have budgeted for that. This includes money for the Region to send extra delegates (because we are entitled to more than we usually have attending from our Intergroups) as well as funds to support Intergroups that want to send delegates but need assistance with funds. This is the single largest area of funding for 2023 at \$11,500.

This year the majority of our expenses were for website and Zoom related costs. Zoom is relatively inexpensive and is used by Committees, the Board, and Officers, as well as the Convention and Assembly. We also upgraded the website this year, hired a new webmaster, and re-allocated some of the costs for website security, all of which increased our expenditures over budget. I have increased the budget for this area to \$9600 in 2023.

We donated \$12,000 to World Service Organization. This was our budgeted donation. I decreased this to \$11,000 for 2023 to balance out the increased costs of travel I have projected.

And Income...

We exceeded expectations for income for the Convention with the final total being \$5655. \$1414 (25%) was shared with the Hosting Intergroups in Chicago. There were no expenses other than the fees for processing the registrations and credit cards. We let the Region absorb those fees rather than listing them as a separate expense. Almost all the registrations were done online.

Contributions are down somewhat this year. A list of contributions by meeting and state is included in this packet. We also have contributions from OA members from outside the Region. Entering contributions and registration data into our QuickBooks database is the biggest job of the Treasurer, as you can probably tell from the 6 pages of meeting contribution information you have! The budget estimated \$28,000 in donations based on donations from 2021. However, it appears that as groups have moved either back to in person or into permanent virtual, contributions have gone down. I budgeted \$26,000 for 2023 due to this.

I hope this explanation helps as you read through the budget information. Write down your questions — I'm more than happy to answer them. And remember — this is our Region and our Region's money. Let us use it well to further Recovery throughout the Region.



I think I can speak for Preston and myself when I say it has been a great honor to serve on this committee for the past year. Personally, as a co-chair I have had to learn about delegating responsibilities, trusting that those responsibilities will be completed (and completed in a satisfactory manner), increasing my active listening skills and deepening my understanding of what it means to "Let go and let God."

We had a total of 15 regularly attending subcommittee members; each assisting with planning every detail of the convention. Without their continuous support this convention would not have been possible. Thank you to Deanna B, Gerri M., Marilyn A, Rose Marie G., Ree L., Darlette P, Maureen M., Christine G., Phil C., Kelly, Lori de R., Robin E., Chris B., CJ M., and Martha, D. Thank you also to Joel I. for your calming guidance and wisdom.

During the weekend we added 26 additional volunteers whose names are too many to list here. Your assistance with Zoom co-hosting, moderating, and the reading of OA materials is invaluable. It allowed the rest of us to sit back and enjoy the convention while you took the wheel for a while.

Here are a few statistics related to the Region 5 2022 Convention:

- We had a total of 284 unique registrations (several were duplicated).
- A very small number of Fellows used the mail-in registration form (3); we do not recommend using this option in the future. There are ways members can help each other register if they need help with online registration and access.
- Members linked to the Region 5 online registration form through several pathways.
 Those pathways include OACleveland.org (81), ChiwifOA.org (24), OAMilwaukee (22), OA.org (41), OA.org (41), and Google.com (22). It appears your websites are actively beneficial to the good of OA.
- Registrations were from Canada and the US only even though we were listed on the Virtual Region's newsletter. English was the only language identified on our flier. We had representatives from all regions within North America with high concentrations outside Region 5 in Region 4 (Nebraska), Region 2 (San Francisco), and Region 7 (New Jersey and New York).
- Our total income was \$5,655. The hosting Intergroups (Chicago Suburban Southwest, Suburban North, Chicago West Far Out, and Turning Point) are discussing what they want to do with their portions of these proceeds.

 We reached out to 9 members that identified themselves as newcomers. All but one had received the "Where Do I Start?" pamphlet prior to the convention. The additional member received the link immediately that weekend through our Newcomer Room subcommittee.

Our exit survey was completed by 137 Fellows. Here are a few significant takeaways:

- Overwhelming amount of positive comments about the speakers. We had a total of 22 speakers sharing their recovery with us that weekend.
- Significantly greater positive comments on the ease and convenience of a virtual
 convention. However, should the convention need to be virtual in the future we would
 highly recommend a hybrid presentation. Equal percentages of the Fellowship are ready
 to be reunited. Given our experience with video communications a hybrid convention is a
 viable solution.
- We offered a lunch break reading and sharing session which was met with enthusiasm and gratitude.
- There were equal numbers of positive and negative comments on the length of the event. As a committee we thought members might be tired of virtual conventions by now and we went with an abbreviated format.
- There were significant comments on the access to the convention. (The links came too late. They wanted to see the program earlier. Or they could not find the links and/ or proof of registration because it went into their spam). I think I can speak for Preston and myself when I say it has been a great honor to serve on this committee for the past year. Personally, as a co-chair I have had to learn about delegating responsibilities, trusting that those responsibilities will be completed (and completed in a satisfactory manner), increasing my active listening skills and deepening my understanding of what it means to "Let go and let God."

We had a total of 15 regularly attending subcommittee members; each assisting with planning every detail of the convention. Without their continuous support this convention would not have been possible. Thank you to Deanna B, Gerri M., Marilyn A, Rose Marie G., Ree L., Darlette P, Maureen M., Christine G., Phil C., Kelly, Lori de R., Robin E., Chris B., CJ M., and Martha, D. Thank you also to Joel I. for your calming guidance and wisdom.

During the weekend we added 26 additional volunteers whose names are too many to list here. Your assistance with Zoom co-hosting, moderating, and the reading of OA materials is invaluable. It allowed the rest of us to sit back and enjoy the convention while you took the wheel for a while.

Here are a few statistics related to the Region 5 2022 Convention:

- We had a total of 284 unique registrations (several were duplicated).
- A very small number of Fellows used the mail-in registration form (3); we do not recommend using this option in the future. There are ways members can help each other register if they need help with online registration and access.
- Members linked to the Region 5 online registration form through several pathways.
 Those pathways include OACleveland.org (81), ChiwifOA.org (24), OAMilwaukee (22),
 OA.org (41), OA.org (41), and Google.com (22). It appears your websites are actively beneficial to the good of OA.
- Registrations were from Canada and the US only even though we were listed on the Virtual Region's newsletter. English was the only language identified on our flier. We had representatives from all regions within North America with high concentrations outside Region 5 in Region 4 (Nebraska), Region 2 (San Francisco), and Region 7 (New Jersey and New York).
- Our total income was \$5,655. The hosting Intergroups (Chicago Suburban Southwest, Suburban North, Chicago West Far Out, and Turning Point) are discussing what they want to do with their portions of these proceeds.
- We reached out to 9 members that identified themselves as newcomers. All but one had received the "Where Do I Start?" pamphlet prior to the convention. The additional member received the link immediately that weekend through our Newcomer Room subcommittee.

Our exit survey was completed by 137 Fellows. Here are a few significant takeaways:

- Overwhelming amount of positive comments about the speakers. We had a total of 22 speakers sharing their recovery with us that weekend.
- Significantly greater positive comments on the ease and convenience of a virtual convention. However, should the convention need to be virtual in the future we would highly recommend a hybrid presentation. Equal percentages of the Fellowship are ready to be reunited. Given our experience with video communications a hybrid convention is a viable solution.

- We offered a lunch break reading and sharing session which was met with enthusiasm and gratitude.
- There were equal numbers of positive and negative comments on the length of the event. As a committee we thought members might be tired of virtual conventions by now and we went with an abbreviated format.
- There were significant comments on the access to the convention. (The links came too late. They wanted to see the program earlier. Or they could not find the links and/ or proof of registration because it went into their spam). As a committee we realize even with an in-person convention the Fellowship does not have access to the program prior to walking into the hotel.
- Based on comments, if the convention is virtual in the future we would recommend recording the speakers.

A new flash drive is in the process of being consolidated and will be shared with the new Convention Committee. I ask all representatives to please consult with their Intergroups and consider hosting a 2023 Region 5 Convention. I promise you will not regret it.

INTERGROUP TO INTERGROUP SUB-COMMITTEE REPORT

OA REGION 5 FALL ASSEMBLY 2022

The intergroup-to-Intergroup Subcommittee is also known as IG2IG, IG Best Practices and IG Resources. We met June 6, July 16, August 10, September 14.

The committee is pursuing two lines of effort:

PART 1: R5's Digital Content Coordinator requested that committee members update IG information on R5 Website. This was done by selecting "Intergroup List" from menu bar, then select "Want to update...", then select "Submit Intergroup Information". All IG's are encouraged to keep their information current.

PART 2: The committee is preparing a web site page entitled "IG Best Practices" which lists areas in which some IG's have experience to share. Other IG's can select one to view different ways IG's are functioning in that area. Currently our "bingo card" looks like

General Liability Insurance	Social Media (Facebook, Twitter, etc)
IG Website – Design, Management and Support	Public Outreach to hospitals, providers, etc.
Phone Line	Workshops, Training, Conventions
Electronic Donations	Spreading the Message

The committee decided to use responses from 2019 survey because (1) the data has not been used yet and we don't want to burden IG's with another survey when we had not used the first survey (2) we are using the survey to identify categories we want to begin with and those are pretty basic.

The committee looked at a variety of ways to present information from each IG – from very long explanations to just IG name and contact information. We decided to start with entries which include one or two sentences describing the IG's experience in that area along with generic contact information (no personal numbers or emails). Currently, committee members are filling out their information on mockup documents so we can see what it looks like when several are combined on one page.

We feel this will be a great resource for IG's to start out in another area, truly sharing our EXPERIENCE, strength, and hope.

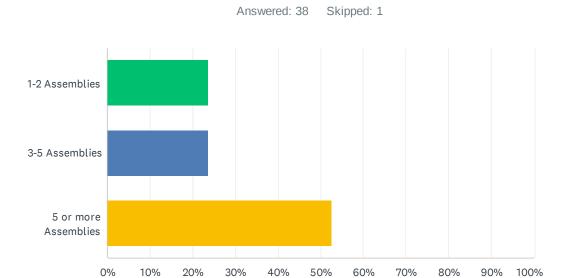

Q2 Does Region 5 have room for improvement? In what ways?

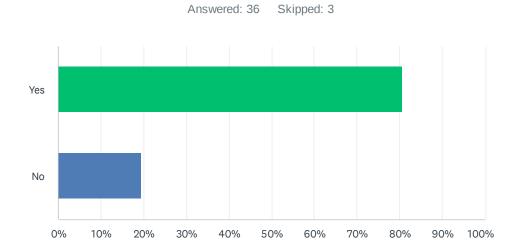

Q3 Do we set realistic short and long-term goals in our committees?

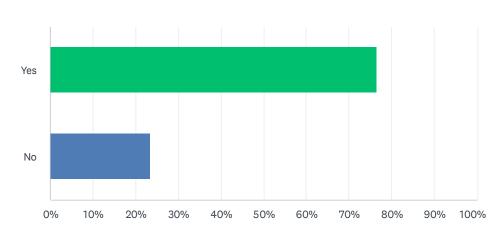

Q4 Do the committee's goals accomplish our primary purpose or the purpose of the committee?



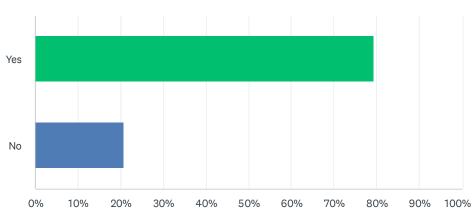

Q5 Do we choose our service people with care and consideration, placing principles before personalities, for the welfare of the region as a whole?



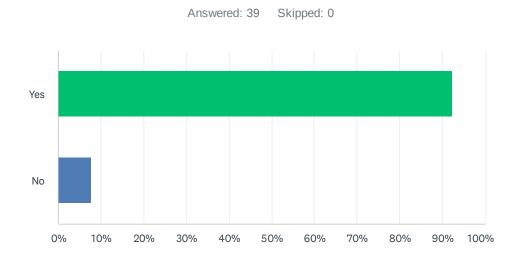

Q6 Is an opportunity given to each member to participate in the region's activities?

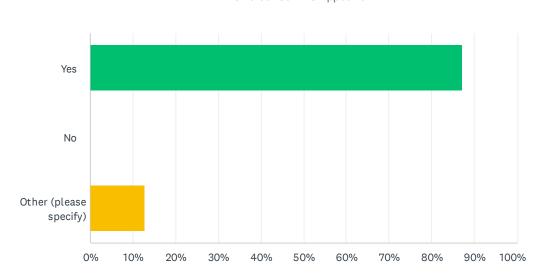

Q7 Do region assemblies adhere to an agenda?

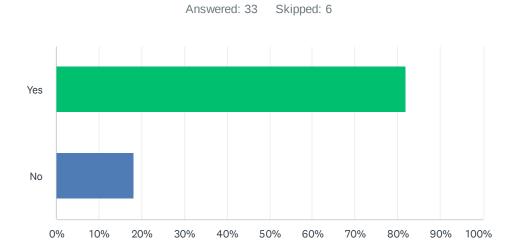

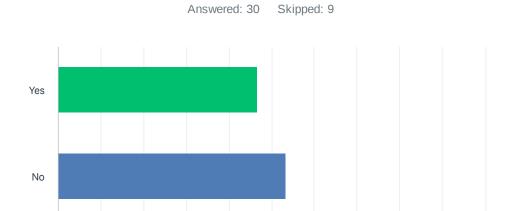

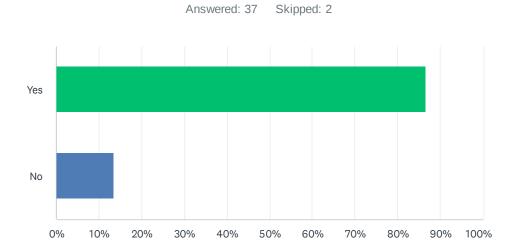

Q10 Do we inform all new representatives of the structure of OA?

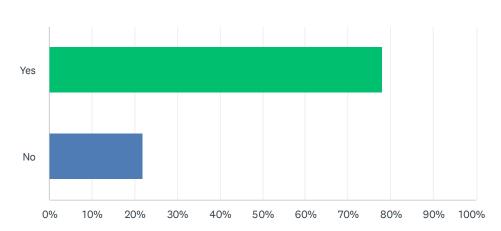

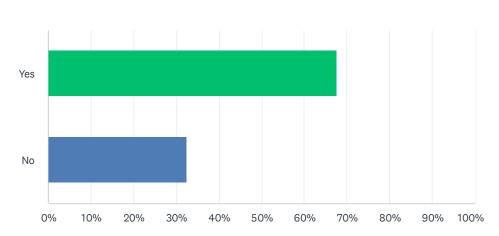

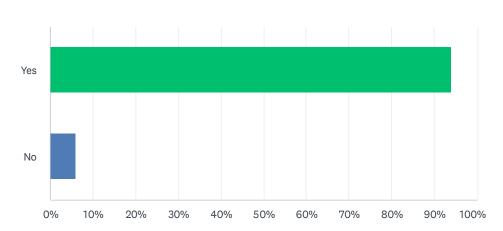
